

26) The Koran does not forbid dancing, but forbids corruption.

Not only the Koran does not avoid dancing but indirectly allows dancing. As the Koran approves the books of Prophet David:

Koran 4:163 We have inspired you, as we inspired Noah and the prophets after him. And we inspired Abraham, Ismail, Isaac, Jacob, the Patriarchs, Jesus, Job, Jonah, Aaron, and Solomon. **And we gave David the Psalms.**

Koran 17:55 Your Lord is the best knower of everyone in the heavens and the earth. In accordance with this knowledge, we preferred some prophets over others. **For example, we gave David the Psalms.**

Koran 21:105 We have decreed in the Psalms, as well as in other scriptures, that the earth shall be inherited by My righteous worshipers.

And in Psalm of David, we see that David loved to play musical instruments (Harp) and danced many times.

Psalms 150:3 Praise Him with the sound of the trumpet; Praise Him with the lute and harp! **4** Praise Him with the timbrel and dance; Praise Him with stringed instruments and flutes! **5** Praise Him with loud cymbals; Praise Him with clashing cymbals!

Other books of the Bible also talk about this:

Job 21:11 They send forth their little ones like a flock, And their children dance. **12** They sing to the tambourine and harp, And rejoice to the sound of the flute.

2 Samuel 6:14 Then David danced before the Lord with all his might; and David was wearing a linen ephod. **15** So David and all the house of Israel brought up the ark of the Lord with shouting and with the sound of the trumpet.

So dancing is encouraged but corruption or corruptive dances or any corruptive action is forbidden in any of the Abrahamic religion.

Koran 7:56 Do not corrupt the earth after it has been set straight, and worship Him out of reverence, and out of hope. Surely, GOD's mercy is attainable by the righteous.
